# ANDY BELTON IS MY TWIN!

## Shunned brother speaks out



SHOOTING: He likes to grin



BELETON: The politician with a heart of granite

A man claiming to be the long-forgotten twin of Union Chief Andy Belton, sent out a heartfelt plea this week, begging to be re-united with the brother who has cruelly spurned him.

Nobody knew or cared whether Kevin Belton existed until he escaped

from his nineteen year isolation in a secure psychiatric hospital, to speak to *The Student* of the worries he has suffered and the secret life of his famous brother.

But, despite the rights of men and the years that Kevin was bullied because of his brother, he still adores "darling twosome".

At the age of seven Andrew ignored his parents' protests and imbedded Kevin in his childhood from the family and sent away in a life of misery and despair at Sal-

isbury Home, Fulgum, Devon.

"We said I had been very naughty and had played the family into chaos, after I failed to complete my homework on time."

"It was all a misunderstanding - I was only trying to help a friend of mine to get his assignment in on time," said Kevin, chucking back the tears.

"What the next thing I knew a group of men in white coats hurt into my bedroom.

"He was always slaver than me and I can understand why he got so cross. Andy never used to play with other children, but used to bully at teachers across the playground."

"At playtime he would never swap secrets with the other boys but would just whisper in the corner with his little school, Brian," he added.

Over the past few years Kevin has been privately following the footsteps of his public political brother

through newspaper cuttings which he collects in scrap-books - over a hundred of which are stacked up in his Victorian cell at Salisbury.

### Quest

The neglected twin has been asked, in his fifteen-year quest to seek out and be reunited with Andrew, by Naima Lupina Berman who cared for both brothers as babies.

Since Kevin was incarcerated

## Anger after 6th formers go missing

Angry parents slammed top-level officials at looney left: Leeds University last night for losing their kids.

A group of five sixth-formers vanished without trace from an open day at the campus last week.

The distraught parents of Clive Battenbury, John Houghton, Emma Handcastle, Flaura Potts and Roddy Bradshaw (all 16) have this message for the Uni bigwigs: "Give us our kids or we'll see you in court."

They say the University is negligent and are demanding that the Council take these 31,000 students extra care.

They failed to return for appointments and interviews at the same department later that afternoon.

Police have been not found and extensive searches maintained around the campus. But so far nothing has been found.

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# Why Rolf's still at the top after 30 years in showbiz!

## AN AUSSIE ON TOP!

He's talented, he's funny, he's an artist, he's Australia's top entertainer. After 30 years in showbiz, Rolf Harris is still going strong, and he intends to stay as the top-Rolf, star of TV show *Rolf Harris' Cartoon Time* and his long-running Aussie fare *'Sun, Airie'* knows that he might not be as big as Happy Mondays, but he's got the talent to stay at the top.

Long time family favourite Rolf was in Leeds recently signing copies of his latest joke book, and gave the fans loads of Guinness, punk rockers and students all waited patiently for their autographs and cartoons, proving that these really still is a place for family entertainment. With TV dominated by the kind of comedians your granny couldn't watch, it's nice to know that Rolf won't be going 'alternative'!

### Crazy!

"No," he says, leaning back in his chair. "It's still doing the same sort of stuff that I do, it would be crazy for me to try and be a Ben Elton 'cause I'm not that sort of guy. I haven't got that alternative ability to look at the world and someone that looks at the bodies of the human being and so on. He bares his soul a bit too much for me. I don't want to reveal those sides of me. My entertainment is gentle and has a lot of different sides to it, there's the painting, the singing, there's stuff that I like to involve the audience."

"And it's clear that audience involvement is one of the mainstays of your comedy Rolf. He turns the audience like the old pro he is, putting a silly smile on the faces of the ladies and getting his younger fans smiling hugely. Rolf loves people, and he enjoys being comedy's own Dr. Freud."

"I love the comedy of itself where some guy will pick on a member of the audience and build up his confidence before shooting him down in flames. I don't go to a show to be insulted by some jerk on stage. It's a very American sort of thing, and what it does for my kind of entertainment is ruin any chances of audience participation. People will come to the show and won't get involved through fear of being



humiliated, and then they regret it."

### Nauseating

We all know how difficult kids can be, but this never puts family man Rolf off his job.

"I love working with kids, but sometimes it's difficult, you get one or two who are particular nauseating, and will walk off over me because I'm not the kind of person who can turn round and say 'shut-up, I haven't got it in me'."

"It's not surprising that in 30 years at the top Rolf has tried his hand at plenty of things. When he goes on holiday, there's no time for looking at the Shellas on the beach!

"I'm a very creative guy, for example on holidays, I can't bear lying on a beach, or being on a boat on some river for 3 hours because all this time I'm thinking 'flee, I could be making something all this time, I could be doing some woodwork, carving or polishing a piece of stone and making some jewellery from it'. You have an end product, a substance. Something someone could have as a present. They'd be thrilled that you'd taken the time, and you'd be thrilled that they were thrilled. No money has changed hands and you both feel better."

But cooking a steot at the South Beach Show (intellectuals who always talk and never do, Rolf won't be writing a University course about his work!

"Yes, I've never really analysed it that deeply. I just love drawing and painting, singing and making things, and the cartoon things that I do on TV are as much a labour of love as anything. When I was a young

man my Dad showed me the basics of animation with a sheet of paper and a pen and it amazed me. The whole idea of placing a drawing on top of another and creating the illusion of movement was shocking and I loved that idea, and treasure it to this day. It brings a drawing to life and you show it to kids and it's magic, it works every time."

### Freak!

Rolf Harris is one great big bundle of fun to talk to, all sniggering in TV's most famous board. Overpowering and overwhelming, but always friendly, it's like having your own one man show! He draws cartoons for all to see and performs his well-rehearsed animal noises. He's clearly delighted when the excited crowd lap it up.

"I've actually a sound book, I pick up on words, especially rhythmic type things that could be used as backing rhythms for songs. Especially animal sounds, like with cats when leaping milk, they lick five times and swallow on the sixth it's a perfect repetitive rhythm."

Rolf deals with his fame unbelievably well. Cool, kind and amusing in the face of 200 fans screaming for Rollersons and autographs, and helpful and talkative in interview upon interview he's always the perfect pro. But he knows all about those fans who can make life hell for TV's top stars.

"Well there's a few people who turn up to everything and send me letters and drawings and so on, and I give them up like me from time to time, and believe it or not there are Rolf Harris fan clubs and appreciation societies that pop up in the strangest

of places which I'm just finding out about. I managed to do a show in Harlow and the manager pulled me to one side and said 'I'd better warn you so you don't get a shock when you go onstage, but the whole front row is wearing glasses and hats, holding pieces of cardboard and pushbrooms, even the girls!'

"Warwick University has named a bar Rolf's after me. When I first heard I thought it was a gigantic prank, but it's very serious. It was originally named after a South African political activist, but the students wanted it to be a fun place, so they voted to change the name, and chose me."

The Rolf is too thick skinned for the 'alternative' comedian to harm him.

"When someone like Phil Cool does an impersonation, it's lovely, especially when he does it so well. I mean it's actually very funny."

As well as being hilariously funny, big-hearted Rolf does his bit for the needy. In between filming more shows for TV, he finds time to help two charities with their work - The Physically Handicapped Able-Bodied Club, and the Iris Fund for Blind Children. He has also donated two huge paintings for auction on Comic Relief Day. But he still found time to write his latest best-selling book 'Joke Time'.

We acknowledge that McDonald's are widely recognised for their support for the environment and conservation of natural resources and we apologise unreservedly to McDonald's for any embarrassment caused in respect of all the allegations contained in the leaflet.




