

FILE :- CAPTAIN P.H. RAWSON MC. RAMC.

This file contains a total of 306 letters recording the correspondence of Captain P.H. Rawson MC with Mary Elizabeth Furnival (fiancé and later, wife). The letters were written from the Western Front while Medical Officer with, successively, 8tR South Staffordshire Regiment, 51st. Field Ambulance, 2/3rd West Riding Field Ambulance and 2/5th Kings Own Yorkshire Light Infantry between 9/2/15 and 15/12/17. In addition there are 13 miscellaneous documents concerning P.H. Rawson and Mary Rawson some of which relate to 1914-18 period.

The letters are principally valuable as a record of a loving and romantic relationship between two people over a prolonged period of enforced separation due to war. In almost every letter there are expressions of love and longing and terms of endearment. The letters record their relationship develop through engagement, marriage and the expectation of their first child.

The following notes examine each letter and pull out details of historical interest. Where this is significant enough to record in 'General Aspects' it is marked in red and is summarised on a separate sheet under the various 'General Aspect' headings. A number written in pencil on both envelope and letter corresponds to the notes to allow quick reference to the original letters. An attempt has been made also to indicate

the continuity of his experience by saying whether Captain Rawson is in the front line, in support, in rest, in training or travelling.

The letters reflect Captain Rawson's rather conventional writing style and the need to avoid the censors pen. Hence they tend to follow a standard mode of which the following is typical.

- ① Thanks for parcels/letters/food/clothing/cigarettes/photos etc
- ② I have sent/received so many letters
- ③ Requests to pass on regards to family + friends
- ④ Enquiries about family + friends
- ⑤ Brief news about his activities mostly of a general nature
- ⑥ Longing for leave + constant references to it and the consequent frustrations + boredom
- ⑦ References to his relationship with Mary Funnal and the attitudes of her parents to this relationship.
- ⑧ Loving sentiment, terms of endearment and expressions of love + longing.
