Colleagues will be sorry to learn of the death, on 8 March 2022, of Mrs Patricia (Pat) Shute, former member of staff in the University Library.

Pat joined the library in 1973 as a library clerk working in the Parkinson Building extension, which held the modern history and language collections, before a new 'west building' extension was built at the rear of the Brotherton Library. During this time she also became the main stalwart of the inter-library loans service based in the main Brotherton Reading Room.
