Natalie Curtis, a survivor of domestic abuse who spoke to The Telegraph via Women's Aid last summer, believes that no club should be allowed to profit in the circumstances, despite the 22-year-old not being prosecuted. "It seems wrong that anyone should profit from the Mason Greenwood situation that has been horrific for survivors," Curtis said. "If anything, if there is a transfer fee, it should be donated to a domestic abuse charity such as Women's Aid."
